
Strategic Plan 2025-2028

PRIORITY ACTION #1

UTILIZE COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIPS TO INCREASE REGIONAL COLLABORATION



- Develop a leadership role and become a hub for key economic development priorities affecting the region such as housing, childcare and workforce development.
- Continue to develop and nurture partnerships with government agencies, First Nations communities and community stakeholders and act as a conduit for shared learning and resources across the region.
- Work with funders to support regional projects that further the needs of communities in a unified way.

PRIORITY ACTION #2

ADVANCE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND BUSINESS RESILIENCY



- Gather information and engage regional stakeholders to create awareness of emergency preparedness programs and best practices.
- Connect the business community with available resources to foster prevention, with the goal of reducing anxiety and minimizing impact.
- Map out the regional business recovery process and set up necessary infrastructure, ready to be deployed when needed.

PRIORITY ACTION #3

ENSURE CONTINUED CLIENT SUCCESS



- Review levels of staff and loans capacity to ensure they are addressing client and community needs.
- Diversify funding streams and identify opportunities for leveraging, increasing both amount of funds available and leveraged.
- Develop and implement a communications strategy to showcase clients' and CFEK's success stories.

PRIORITY ACTION #4

INCREASE CAPACITY OF BOARD AND STAFF



- Update the existing Board matrix and create a Board Director succession plan, maximizing skill utilization and building capacity where needed.
- Analyze staff workload capacity to determine present staffing levels and identify roadmap to increase staffing levels in the future.
- Acquire sustainable funding and execute increase in staffing levels, based on set targets and benchmarks to trigger growth.
